THE DEPARTMENT OF OTOLARYNGOLOGY,

COURSE IN EXTERNAL SEPTORHINOPLASTY
FEBRUARY 7TH THROUGH 11TH, 1977

THE Department of Otolaryngology, University of Toronto, will conduct a workshop in septorhinoplasty using the external approach, 7—11 February, 1977.

External rhinoplasty offers the surgeon an advantage in that the anatomy and pathology may be directly visualized. This results in precise surgery of the nasal dorsum, exact correction of defects of the upper lateral cartilages and more accurate augmentation procedures.

The five-day intensive course will offer daily live colour televised surgery, daily surgery in the anatomy laboratories, lectures and seminars on the art and science of septorhinoplasty, and discussions of mistakes, disappointments and complications of this type of surgery.

Special attention is given to the severe nasal-septal deformities as this is the nasal problem that is best corrected by the external approach.

Enrolment is limited by the resources of the Department of Anatomy. The registration fee is \$500. For application forms or for further information, write to Office of Continuing Education, Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto, Toronto, Canada, M5S 1A8.
