Through this contest, it is hoped that international understanding of the Chinese language and its literature will be strengthened, and that an active and vital tie with the non-Chinese literary world will be encouraged.

The TITLE of the contest is *The Chinese*. Entries may be original creation in any of the accepted forms such as Poems, Essays, and Short Stories, and may be in either the Classic or Modern language. The length should be less than five thousand characters.
