This book is a philosophical critique of egoism from two perspectives. First, it addresses itself to the contemporary professional debate about egoism which appears in journals and books. Second, it relates this debate to ordinary practical concerns by appealing to analyses of such notions as weakness of will, false desire, productive love, and self-respect. Part I begins with an argument that the single-minded pursuit of happiness is self-defeating, and concludes with a Kantian refutation of teleological theories of right and wrong through appeal to Principles of Coherent Integration, Practical Reason, and Moral Consistency. Part II presents an analysis of personal good based on an extended discussion of faulty desire. The author uses this analysis to construct a philosophical formulation of Erich Fromm's notion of productive love and to argue that productive love of self, since it includes self-respect, is inseparable from love of others.

Richmond Campbell earned his Ph.D. at Cornell (1970). He is now Associate Professor of Philosophy at Dalhousie University, where he has taught since 1968.
