

ERRATUM

In *LARR* 17, no. 3 (1982), a research report entitled "The 1980 Image-Index Survey of Latin American Political Democracy," by Kenneth H. Johnson, contained two tables of data that were published with inadvertent errors. In column 6 of table 1, "Scholarly Image of Political Democracy in Latin America for 1980," (p. 198), the correct entry for Brazil was inadvertently dropped. Consequently, the score for Chile was listed next to Brazil, the score for Colombia was listed next to Chile, and so on down through Haiti. This error appeared in the original manuscript and was reproduced in the published version. A perceptive reader with a particular interest in freedom of the press, Clarence Moore, publisher of *The Times of the Americas*, noted the discrepancies and called them to the attention of the author and the current editors. A review of the data in both tables also found two errors in table 2, "Image Index, 1980: Rank Orderings" (p. 199), one from the original manuscript and one added during the typesetting, neither of which affected the rank orderings or the analysis.

Because these data may be used for secondary analysis, the correct data for column 6 of table 1 and for the two items under "Select Criteria" of table 2 are given below. The author and editors regret any inconvenience caused and wish to thank Mr. Moore for bringing the matter to our attention.
