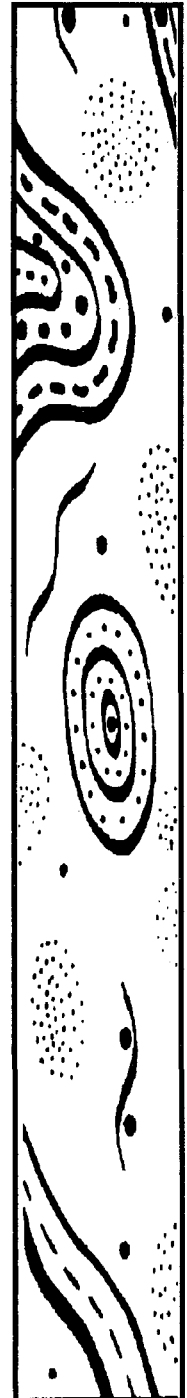
Unfortunately, we are no longer able to do this, although for the remainder of 1995 some schools will continue to receive free copies of the journal.

To continue receiving the journal in 1996, however, all subscribers will need to take out a financial subscription. As always, we will endeavour to keep subscription costs as low as possible.

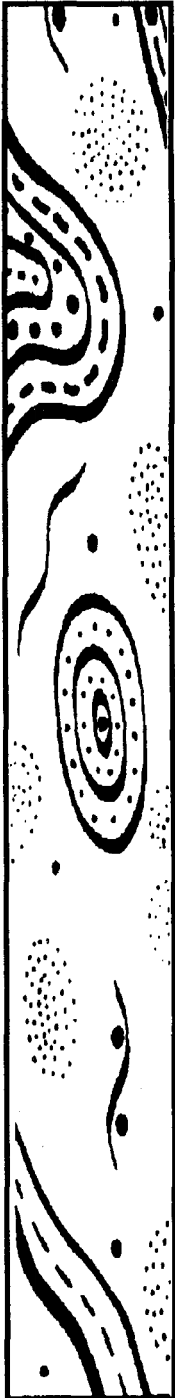

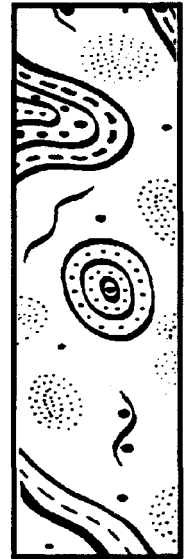


The Aboriginal Child at School — Available Back Issues
