to introduce more progressive regimes and treatment programmes despite problems in recruitment and the isolation of the hospital. His career suffered the cruellest of blows on St Andrew's day in 1976 when two patients at Carstairs escaped, in the process killing a fellow patient, a nurse and a local policeman. The gruesome circumstances of the killings and their aftermath set back the progress Kenneth had painstakingly achieved. His health began to fail not long afterwards and he took early retirement in 1979.

Kenneth will be remembered by his colleagues as one who was kind and considerate to all. Besides his family, Kenneth loved his golf and was a connoisseur of the best of Scotland's produce. He was one of nature's gentlemen.
