

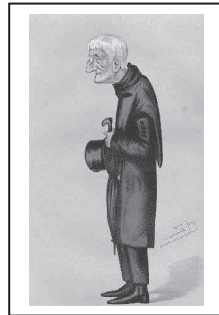

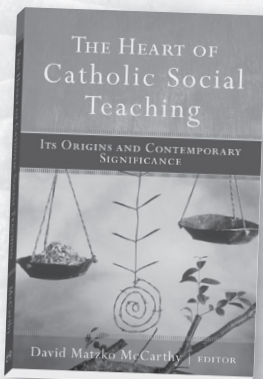

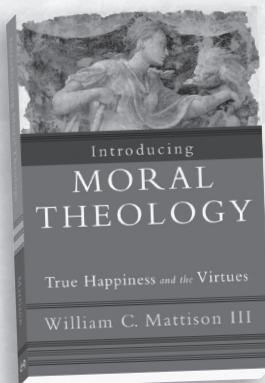
TRUE HAPPINESS AND THE VIRTUES

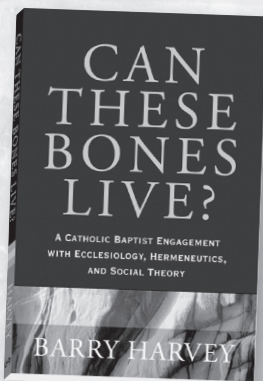
