The *ASN* co-sponsors international conferences in the USA and abroad, sponsors two panels at each AAASS Annual Convention and at the World Congresses of Soviet and East European Studies, and maintains close contact with several academic institutions located in the former USSR and in Eastern Europe, as well as with numerous Western European organizations.

The ASN edits a semi-annual journal, Nationalities Papers and publishes a monograph series in 'Issues Studies' and the Analysis of Current Events.

ASN membership is international, with all the five continents represented, including members from the Russian Federation and other former Soviet Republics.
