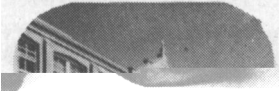
TREATMENT IN RESIDENTIAL CARE

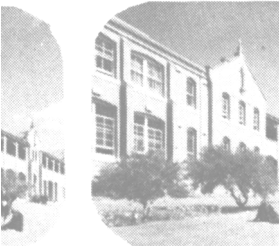


PSYCHOTHERAPY WITH CHILDREN IN CARE

notes to contributors . . .

1. Manuscripts should be typewritten on one side only, with double spacing and wide margins. Two copies are essential, three or four desirable. The approximate number of words should be stated.
2. References should be referred to in the text by giving, in brackets, the surname of the author and should be listed in numerical order at the end of the article, as follows:
Books: Author's name and initials; year of publication (in brackets); title of book underlined; publisher; page reference, if appropriate.
Articles: Author's name and initials; date of publication (in brackets); title of article; abbreviated title of journal underlined; volume and number.
3. Footnotes should be kept to a minimum.
4. Book reviews should also be typed and sent to the Book Review Editor, Cliff Picton, Department of Social Work, Monash University, Clayton, Victoria, 3168.
