1975 Rules for the Annual Business Meeting and Association Elections

On April 12, 1975, the Association's Council approved the following rules proposed by the Rules Committee to govern the conduct of the

Association's 1975 Annual Business Meeting and election.

1. Annual Business Meeting: Attendance and Participation

The right "to attend and to participate in the Annual Business Meeting of the Association" is constitutionally accorded "all members, upon
