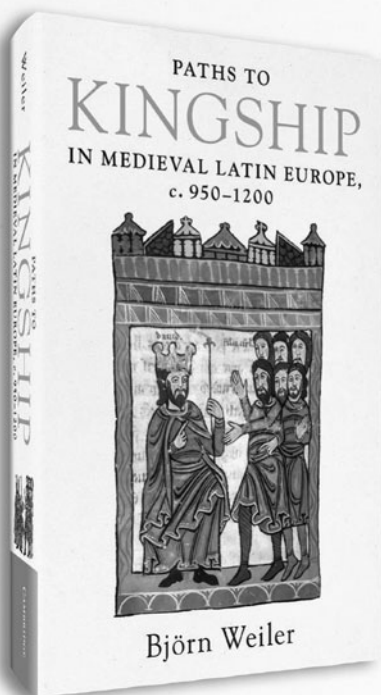


PATHS TO KINGSHIP IN MEDIEVAL LATIN EUROPE, C. 950–1200
