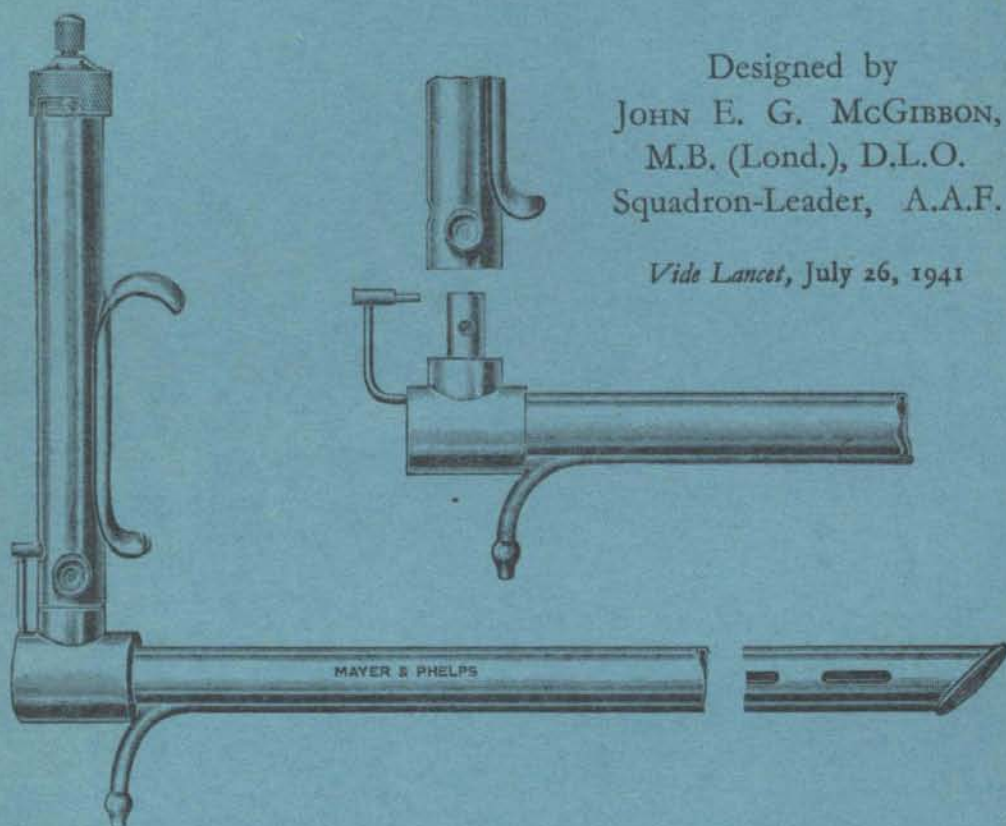

A Bronchoscope self contained with battery in handle, dispensing with entangling cables.

The Bronchoscope was designed for Bronchial aspiration and insufflation of oxygen in cases of emergency.

The handle is provided with a finger rest to facilitate introduction, and is detachable for sterilization.

Oesophagoscopes and Bronchoscopes can be made of various lengths and calibres as desired (*see page 73, Catalogue of Laryngology*). That illustrated above is 40 cm. \times 10 mm.
