### Policy

### Manuscript Submission

**What to submit:** Five copies of the manuscript and an abstract of about 100 words, together with a brief biographical description of the author(s). Manuscripts submitted to the *Review* must not be under consideration by another publication. Manuscripts cannot be returned to authors.

**Manuscript format:** Delete all identifying references from four of the five copies of your manuscript. Text, including footnotes and references, should be double spaced with 1-inch margins. Footnotes, references, tables, and figures should be placed at the end. An abridged style sheet is published regularly in the *Review*; a full style sheet is available on request.

## **CALL FOR NOMINATIONS 1998 STUDENT AWARDS**

The **Law and Society Association** is seeking nominations for its **Student Awards** which will be presented at the Association's Annual Meeting in Aspen, Colorado in June, 1998. Awards will be offered to those whose nominated paper best represents outstanding law and society research in two categories: undergraduate papers; and graduate or law student papers. The awards in each category are \$100 cash and up to \$400 toward travel cost to attend the meeting. Nominations can be made only by a *non-student member* of the Law and Society Association and through the submission of the recommended student paper to the Committee on Student Awards. The committee includes **Barbara Yngvesson**, chair (Hampshire College), **Jonathan Casper** (Northwestern University), **Audrey Kobayashi** (Queen's University), and **Thomas Russell** (University of Texas, Austin). We seek to expand the pool of submissions, and we urge you to send along papers you admire.

The subject matter of the recommended papers should be in the interdisciplinary tradition of law and society research, and should reflect the style of articles that appear in the *Law & Society Review*. We intend to be inclusive of all work that examines law in culture and society including interpretive, historical, social scientific and jurisprudential scholarship. All papers entered in the competition should be written by matriculated students at any (U.S. or non-U.S.) institution of higher education between September 1996 and January 1998. Submissions will be evaluated within each category.
