VOPROSY PSYCHOLOGII Psychology Issues The oldest scientific psychology journal of Russia

The main goal of the journal is to present readers with the latest achievements of scientific Psychology. Reflecting the current situation, the journal attempts to promote the development of basic theoretical research, methods to solve practical problems, and the introduction of psychological knowledge in real life. The journal is intended for professional psychologists, particularly specialists dedicated to psychopedagogical problems of education and learning, for professionals within the national educational system (from preschool to university level), as well as for a broad circle of readers interested in psychology.

The journal is divided into the following sections: "Theoretic research," "Developmental and pedagogic psychology," "Psychology and practice," "Psychological consultation," "Thematic news," "Discussion and debate," "History of psychology," "Ephemerides," "Research methods," "From work experience," "Critique and bibliography," "Abroad," "Editor's mailbox," "Our honored ones," and others.

The index of each issue and the abstracts of the articles are published in English.

In the year 2000, *Voprosy psichologii* won the national Psychology prize "Professional Balance of the Century" in the category "Most popular (read) periodical professional Psychology publication of Russia."

In 2005, the journal *Voprosy psichologii* has celebrated its 50th anniversary.

During the past few years, the journal has been actively involved in the development of new ways to present journalistic material. A CD has been edited, which presents the electronic version of the journal issues published between 1988 and 2002. In this CD-Rom, there are over 2000 articles, most of which provide an abstract in English. The search system in the Russian and English languages allows one to quickly locate the required material by sections, topics, psychological terms, and authors' surnames. As of 2004, readers can subscribe to the journal not only in the normal version (printed) but also in the electronic version, which is presented in Internet on the website www.voppsy.ru.

Voprosy psichologii is open not only to Russian authors but also to foreigners.

The journal is published six times a year and each issue contains 160 pages.

SIBERIAN PSYCHOLOGY JOURNAL

The *Siberian Psychology Journal* was founded in 1995 by the Psychology Faculty of the State University of Tomsk (Siberia, Russia) and the Institute of Education of Siberia, the Far East, and the North of the Academy of Education of Russia.

The *Siberian Psychology Journal* is a biannual publication of a scientific-practical nature, dedicated to the science and practice of Psychology. Its readers are people who are interested in Psychology, especially professional psychologists and researchers, Psychology teachers, postgraduate and graduate Psychology students, and also professionals from similar areas: philosophers, pedagogues, sociologists, and doctors, among others. The basic sections of the journal are: Social psychology, Clinical (medical) psychology, Developmental psychology, Personality psychology, and Pedagogic psychology, among others. The sections are not preset and their representation may vary in each issue.

The journal's working language is Russian, but the abstracts and notes of the materials of the journal are also provided in English, although the contents are only abstracted and indexed in Russian databases. The contents of the latest journal issues can be seen on the website of the Psychology Faculty of the State University of Tomsk (TGU) at <http://psy.tsu.ru>.

The founder of the journal and chief editor is Professor Genrikh Vladislavovich Zalevski, Full Professor of Genetic and Clinical Psychology of the Psychology Faculty of the TGU. The editorial board comprises more than 20 scientists from 13 cities of Russia and Germany. Among them, for example, are V. P. Zinchenko, A. V. Petrovski, A. G. Asmolov, V. S. Mukhina (Moscow), and L. I. Wasserman (Saint Petersburg), among others.

The journal publishes articles not only by Siberian psychologists, but also by psychologists from other regions of Russia, from the Community of Independent States (CEI), and from other countries. The articles published do not exceed 20 pages.
