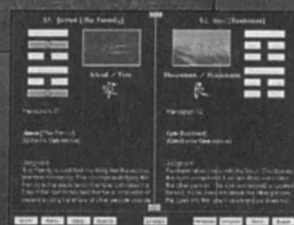

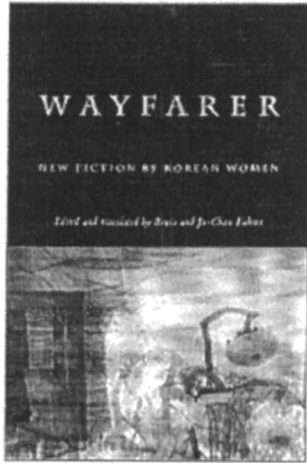

Applications are invited from suitably qualified scholars who can do good empirical and policy-oriented research, based on sound scholarship, on the People's Republic of China, particularly her attempt at economic, social and political reforms since 1979.

Applicants should have good social sciences training in the broad fields of economics, sociology, political science and law. Intellectual maturity and a good command of English are important prerequisites. Actual working experience in China would be an additional asset. Successful candidates will be offered an initial contract of two years which is renewable. They will be expected to assume duties as soon as possible.

Salaries offered will be within the range: Gross S\$56,920–S\$150,000 per annum depending on qualifications and experience. (About US\$1 = S\$1.41.) In addition, research fellows enjoy benefits which include subsidized housing and medical care and education allowance for their children.

The Institute of East Asian Political Economy (IEAPE) is an independent, non-profit research organization set up for the study of contemporary East Asian societies in their modernization processes. It has a library and computer database with a comprehensive collection of material on contemporary China. Currently the Institute's major research focus is on modern China.

The Institute will also consider applications for short term visiting research arrangements for less than a year.
