Here's how it works:

Set up an INFO-SOUTH user code by calling our customer service desk at 305-284-4414. Then call the database through your modem, anytime, 24 hours a day. A quick search will tell you what's available. You can read the summaries, copy them, or ask for immediate FAX delivery of the documents. A typical search costs \$40.

INFO-SOUTH has recently made several changes to speed its service:

Accelerated abstracting. Most abstracts are now online within two weeks of publication. Citations appear almost immediately.

New "mini-abstracts." Brief summaries of speeches or documents by major Latin American political leaders alert users to policy shifts.

Free trial access. Prospective users will receive one week's free access to the database.
