SYMPOSIUM ON PATHOLOGY OF THE MIDDLE EAR

The American Academy of Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology and the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology are sponsoring a Symposium on Histopathology and Pathophysiology of the Middle Ear, funded by a grant from the National Institute of Neurological Diseases and Stroke. This symposium will be held on 7, 8 and 9 December, 1970 in Washington, D.C.

The purpose of this meeting is to present to otolaryngologists, pathologists and pediatricians the most recent clinical and research information basic to the understanding of the pathophysiology of inflammatory and neoplastic diseases of the middle ear. There will be presented papers and panels dealing with ultrastructural anatomy, mucociliary flow, dynamics of fluid transport, microbiology of otitis media, biochemistry and pharmacology of middle ear effusions, pathogenesis of tympanosclerosis and cholesteatoma, middle ear responses to

implanted substances, and neoplasia of the middle ear. A histopathologic slide conference with audience participation is planned.

Funds for attending the symposium are not available; however, there will be no registration fee. Attendance at the symposium will be limited and requests for applications should be submitted before I October 1970, to The Director, Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, Washington, D.C. 20305.




