In this study Jürgen Becker presents a new, historically grounded explanation of the phrases "kingdom of God" and "God's reign" — the central terms of Jesus' proclamation. The author, a professor of the New Testament, draws on an impressive range of sources to trace Jesus' special position within early Judaism. At the same time, he retains his focus on Jesus' ministry, viewed as the beginning of the history of early Christianity. The proclamation of the kingdom is thus seen by Becker as the founding moment of a distinct community of faith.
