THE SEMINAR IN LEGAL PHILOSOPHY, the annual jurisprudence workshop at the University of Western Ontario sponsored by the Law Faculty, will be held August 16-21,1989, at Spencer Hall, an elegant conference centre just off the UWO campus. The Seminar is designed to provide both introductory and advanced work in jurisprudence. Two Academic Programs in Law and Philosophy at the University of Western Ontario. (1) There is a Special Ph.D. Program in Legal Philosophy. This program gives up to four semester courses credits towards the Ph.D. degree for having taken first year law at an accredited law school (antecedent to entering or during the program). Enrolment in the Ph.D. philosophy and law program is undertaken after the completion of an M.A. and with admission to Philosophy through the Graduate (2) There is an LL.B./M.A. program. In this program law students Faculty UWO. at the University of Western Ontario may receive credit towards the LL.B. degree by taking certain philosophy courses (up to four semester courses). Enrolment in the LL.B./M.A.program is undertaken at the end of the first year of LL.B. studies; a special M.A. year in philosophy is taken after completing the LL.B. degree. Graduate students in philosophy are eligible for various forms of financial support, to a maximum of \$12,000.
