

JEH INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS OF REVIEW ARTICLES

Thank you for agreeing to write a review article on the enclosed book(s). We select books for inclusion in such special essays because of the importance of their contribution to the field of economic history, their significance as part of the cumulated work of distinguished scholars in the field, or their value as indications of the state of research or scholarly debate in a given area of the field. As in shorter reviews, we ask that you give readers a clear, concise account of the scope and content of the book(s), together with illustrative examples of its (their) outstanding merits or defects. A review article should, however, go beyond consideration of content and link the book(s) under review to issues of wider importance and critical debate in the field of economic history, or to related fields where appropriate. Please do not take up valuable space pointing out minor errors of fact or typography. If you are reviewing an edited work, avoid commenting in detail on every article in the collection. Short, general observations that may be applied to several articles collectively are always preferable. Reserve detailed comments for those articles that are particularly noteworthy.

1. Send two copies, typed double space (**both heading and text**), on standard size, good quality (not "erasable") paper with 1 1/2-inch margins on all sides.
2. The heading should contain all of this information, in this order:

When more than one book is being reviewed, a **separate entry** (with an extra space between each entry) should be made for each book, using the above format.

3. All stylistic features of the article should conform to the JEH author's style sheet (see the March 1995 issue of the *Journal*) with the following exceptions:
 - a) No abstract should be submitted.
 - b) **Citations and references** should be as follows: when citing material from the book(s) under review, refer to pages of the reviewed book and insert them in parentheses in the text after your comment or quote [(p.6) or (pp. 458-59)]. Citations of any other sources, published or unpublished, should follow the footnote and reference styles indicated in the author's style sheet.
 - c) Type your name and affiliation **flush with the right margin** at the end of the review.

Thank you for agreeing to review the enclosed book. We regard the book review function of the *Journal* as one of our most important responsibilities and choose our reviewers accordingly. We ask that you give readers a clear, concise account of the scope and content of the book, together with illustrative examples of its outstanding merits and/or defects. **Please do not take up valuable space pointing out minor errors of fact or typography.** Hold the book to a high standard but be generous as well: even writing a bad book is a difficult task. Reviewers of **edited works** should not comment in detail on all the articles in the collection. Instead, they should make short, general observations that may be applied to several articles collectively, and reserve detailed comments for a few papers that are particularly noteworthy. We reserve the right to edit your manuscript in accordance with *Journal* style and standard editorial practice. Please observe the following when preparing your review:

1. Send two copies, typed double space (both heading and text), on standard size, good quality (not "erasable") paper with 1 1/2-inch margins on all sides.
2. The heading should contain all of this information, *in this order*:

3. **Do not use footnotes:** refer to pages of the reviewed book, and insert them in parentheses after your comment or quote: (p. 6) or (pp. 458-59). Any other publication mentioned in the review should be cited in the text as follows:

4. The initials or first name of any scholar referred to in a review should be included in the text, the first time the scholar is mentioned.
5. Type your name and affiliation flush with the right margin at the end of the review.

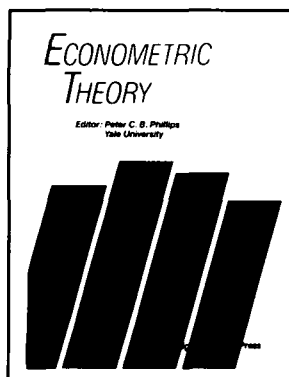

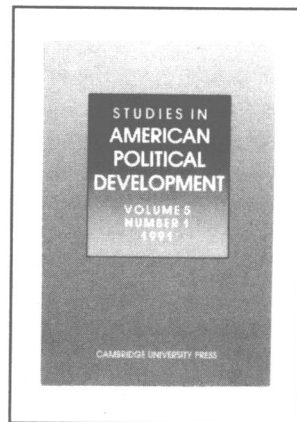
