THE KEYNES PRESS

The second three books in a new series of limited editions of medical classics, published under an imprint named after Sir Geoffrey Keynes.

The first three books published in November 1983 under the imprint of the Keynes Press received critical acclaim and sold rapidly. The second series also comprises three books varying widely in their subject matter but produced to the same high standards of design and typography. One, *Notes on the Composition of Scientific Papers* by Clifford Allbutt, uses the same demy octavo format as the first three; the others, Osler's *Aequanimitas* and Lord Moran's *The Anatomy of Courage*, are in crown quarto, bound respectively in a hand printed Compton marbled paper and "Willow", a William Morris pattern paper in sepia and marigold.

As before, each book has been individually designed by Sebastian Carter of the Rampant Lions Press and each contains a specially commissioned scholarly but lively introduction by an expert: Dr Alex Paton for *Notes*, Professor Hugh Dudley for *Aequanimitas*, and Dr Denis Williams for *The Anatomy of Courage*. A new feature is a full colour reproduction of a portrait of the author. Each of the second three volumes is limited to a total of 300 numbered copies for sale, the price being £35 for *Notes on the Composition of Scientific Papers* and *The Anatomy of Courage* and £40 for *Aequanimitas*, each including postage.

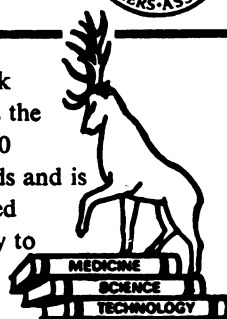
