Fr Lahey's earlier writings for children (God's Heroes; God's Wonderworld) are a warrant of his power to bring home to the young mind the lessons in the life of Our Lord. This narrative, told with the simplicity and enthusiasm of a bed-time story, brings out on every page how Christ is the children's friend, how He came on earth to bring them to heaven by defeating all the enemies who might try to destroy their lives by sin. He is their hero, Who goes about earing for the poor, the sick, the humble, and the outcast lepers, Who eats and drinks with sinners whom He is ready to forgive if they are sorry for having done wrong.
