# RHINOS

## Endangered Species

*Malcolm Penny*



Of the world's five species of rhinoceros, three survive only under strict protection. One, the African white rhinoceros, flourishes in the south of the continent under enlightened management. The African black rhinoceros is being shot to extinction by poachers to supply a market principally financed by one oil-rich Arab country. There are ways of saving the rhinoceros – but can they be applied in time?

In this book, zoologist and television wildlife producer Malcolm Penny surveys our present knowledge of the world's rhinoceroses. Beginning with a discussion of their evolutionary history and individual accounts of the five species, he goes on to consider the factors which have led to their decline. Malcolm Penny stresses that to save them from extinction will take more than money and goodwill. Centuries of tradition cannot be wiped out simply by telling believers that they are wrong and surrounding the remaining animals with armed guards. A stimulating addition to the literature on rhinos.
