This volume, therefore, with all its imperfections, its half-gleaned results, its transitory views, comes forth to show what is already ascertained, and to supply a mass of certain facts for the assimilation of scholars, who may accept or not the way in which they are built up.*

My best hope is that the present volume will prove to have been but the first taste of a deep draught of the history of the early Greeks, drawn from a country which even in their days was worn and aged with the remembrance of conquests and disasters of cycles and dynasties, dimly seen in the past behind it.

In this book is described the details of surgical work as it appears from the point of view of house surgeons and dressers in surgical wards. The original woodcuts have been almost entirely drawn from photographs taken from actual patients or subjects and thus to have secured a somewhat faithful representation of the real appearance of bandages, splints, &c.

In the present edition the letterpress has been carefully revised throughout, and contains notices of those advances in the handicraft of surgery which seem likely to have a permanent value, and in respect of which the book is written up to date. A portion of the work has been re-written and additions have been made in other cases, and the appendices (in addition to the pre-existing formulary) give short directions for the preparation of patients for the operation, for the making of poultices, &c., and for case taking.
