

distinctive opinion. John B. Purcell of Cincinnati spoke most clearly for the inopportunist. Other American bishops added terms on occasions. All told, the story is not new. The Acton correspondence and the observations of Döllinger are helpful to measure the importance of the American participation. Yet, there is missing in this account the journalistic evaluation of the American participation. After all, it is the journalistic reporting of the Second Vatican Council that created most of the current interest. The journalists like to pontificate and occasionally make a good thrust. No one expects them to tell the final story but without them the human comments and humor of the full account may be hidden in the formalities that survive with mediaeval Roman vestments and ceremonies.
