

## THE SCOTTISH SOCIETY OF THE HISTORY OF MEDICINE

THE Report of Proceedings for 1959–60 shows that the Society continues as active and progressive as ever. Warm tribute is paid to Dr. John Ritchie who died on 24 December 1959. He was a co-founder of the Society with Dr. Douglas Guthrie in April 1948. At the Annual General Meeting at Edinburgh in October, Dr. W. S. Mitchell was re-elected President for a third term. At this meeting the Society had the great pleasure of welcoming Dr. F. Noel L. Poynter who gave an outstanding paper on Mr. Thomas Anderson (1743–4–1813), surgeon of Leith, a pioneer of vaccination in Scotland and an early correspondent of Jenner from whom he obtained lymph for use in his practice.

At the ordinary meeting at Dundee in March 1960, Professor Adam Patrick; in a critical analysis of the Plague of Athens, 430 B.C., concluded that the epidemic was, in fact, confluent smallpox. Professor John F. Fulton was to have been guest of the Society at its summer meeting but his tragic and premature death led to the cancellation of that meeting.

The usual medico-historical and book notices with two appendixes complete the Report. The appendixes contain a complete list of the names of the Presidents of the Medico-Chirurgical Society of Edinburgh from its foundation by Andrew Duncan, senior, in 1821, and the contents of a demonstration arranged by Mr. G. R. Pendrill, Librarian of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh, on the occasion of Dr. Poynter's visit, illustrating some sidelights of the history of vaccination in Scotland. There are also an excellent photograph of the late Dr. Ritchie, and of the earliest pharmacy business in Scotland, formerly in the Lawnmarket, Edinburgh.

### A LIST OF PAPERS, ETC., ON LEOPOLD AUENBRUGGER (1722–1809) AND THE HISTORY OF PERCUSSION

THIS year sees the duo-centenary of the publication of Leopold Auenbrugger's *Inventum Novum ex Percussione Thoracis Humani etc.*, Vienna, 1761, the work that introduced the practice of percussion into physical diagnosis. The purpose of this list is to assist those responsible for preparing the commemorative exhibitions which will doubtless take place this year. While it does not pretend to list all writings about Auenbrugger, it is hoped that no major item has been omitted.

### CHARLES BELL AND CHESELDEN

SIR CHARLES BELL has been rightly praised for the beautiful drawings with which he illustrated his own writings. It has therefore come as a surprise to recognize in his famous book on *The Hand* (1833) three engravings of animal skeletons copied without acknowledgment from Cheselden's *Osteographia* of exactly one hundred years earlier. I have lately studied (Le Fanu 1960) the drawings and engravings made for Cheselden's introductory chapters by a little-known Dutch artist, Jacobus Schijnvoet, so that I had them freshly in mind when I happened to look at 'Bell on the Hand' for another purpose.

Bell prints at page 7 an engraving of the skeleton of a bat hanging from a beam. This is taken with slight modification from Cheselden's figure [23]. At page 69 Bell shows the head, thorax, and fore-limbs of a mole; this has been redrawn with much simplification from Cheselden's figure [21], which shows the complete skeleton.

More interesting is the figure on Bell's page 50, where the skeleton of an eagle stands over that of a lizard. Cheselden's eagle [Fig. 18] is attacking a snake; Bell has substituted the lizard which appears independently and facing the other way at Cheselden's [Fig. 15]. In every case Bell's drawing is less detailed and less beautiful than Schijnvoet's in Cheselden's book.
