

CRIMINAL JUSTICE POLICY

From Research to Reform

PETER H. SOLOMON

A provocative, perhaps radical study — a book that challenges even the most widely-held assumptions about criminal justice. Professor Solomon posits that:

- neither plea-bargaining nor court-delay is as threatening as commonly supposed;
- contrary to current thinking, police detectives deserve their distinctive role and status;
- police-initiated stops and interrogations offend the public more than they protect it;
- the processing of minor crimes in court imposes unjustifiably heavy costs.

Unflaggingly, Professor Solomon brings an altogether fresh perspective to his subject, and ends with the bold proposition that Canada adopt a penal order procedure similar to that used in West Germany.

The main purpose of mailing is to encourage you to add the **POLICY STUDIES JOURNAL/POLICY STUDIES REVIEW** to your subscriptions. Those two periodicals constitute the main activity of the Policy Studies Organization. They are each published quarterly and consist of symposia, non-symposium articles, literature reviews, and news concerning policy studies. Each regular issue is about 200 pages, meaning a combination of about 1,600 pages. One \$18 subscription covers both periodicals. Special issues are sometimes provided outside the regular quarterly cycles.

RECENT SYMPOSIA published in *PSJ-PSR* of interest to people in the Law and Society Association include (1) "Criminal Corrections Policy", edited by Jameson Doig, (2) "Regulatory Policy Analysis", edited by Mel Dubnick and Alan Gitelson, (3) "The Law and Politics of Reapportionment", edited by Bernard Grofman, Arend Lijphart, Robert McKay, and Howard Scarrow, and (4) "Judicial Reform", edited by Philip Dubois. Many *PSJ-PSR* issues contain non-symposium articles, emphasizing the evaluation of alternative laws and legal procedures, as well as literature reviews and news items.

PSO DIRECTORIES are now available describing policy studies activities among academic programs, government agencies, funding sources, research centers, individual researchers, and publishers/associations. One of those six directories is available free to new members, and others can be obtained at \$4 apiece for individuals and \$8 for libraries, like back issues of the *Policy Studies Journal/Policy Studies Review*. Future directories and editions are sent to all members without charge.

Dues are **ONLY \$18 A YEAR** for regular members \$12 for student members, and \$42 for library and institutional members.
