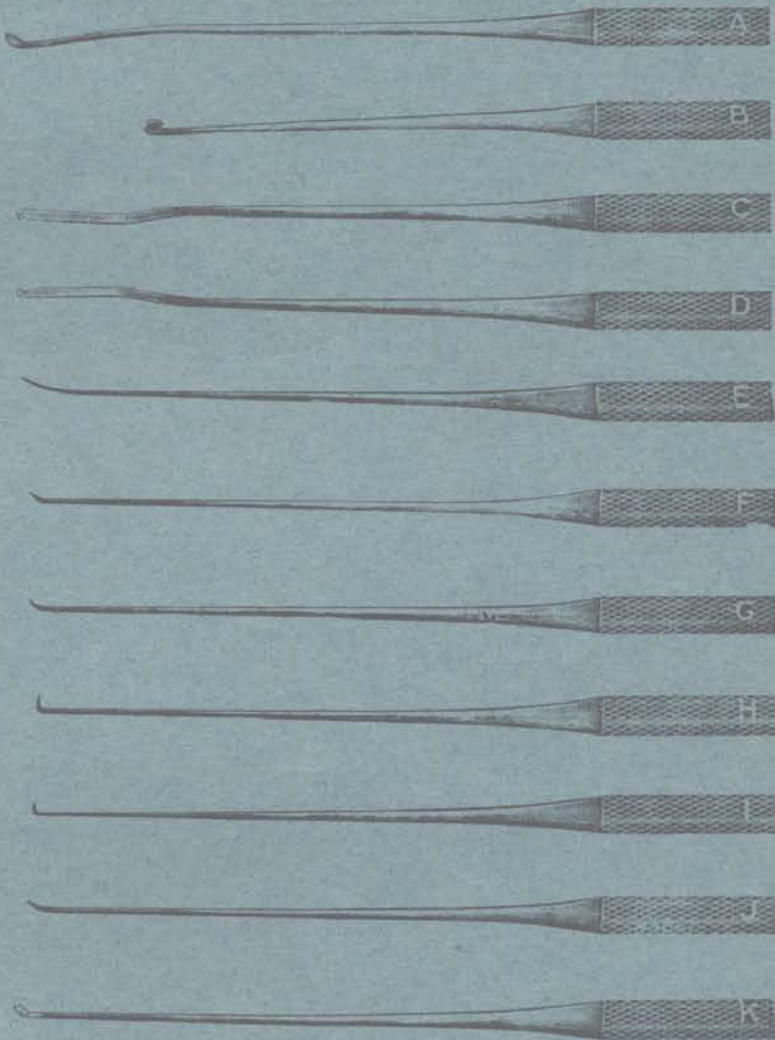
The course will be provided by the Department of Audiology and Education of the Deaf in association with the Department of Otolaryngology and is intended particularly for Consultant Otologists.
