

# Licence

BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

*Pursuant to Section 23 of the Companies Act, 1867.*

---

WHEREAS it has been proved to the Board of Trade that THE MUSICAL ASSOCIATION (INCORPORATED 1904) which is about to be registered under the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1900, as an Association limited by guarantee, is formed for the purpose of promoting objects of the nature contemplated by the 23rd Section of the Companies Act, 1867; and that it is the intention of the said Association that the income and property of the Association whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Association as set forth in the Memorandum of Association of the said Association and that no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend or bonus or otherwise howsoever by way of profit to the members of the said Association.

NOW THEREFORE the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers in them vested and in consideration of the provisions and subject to the conditions contained in the Memorandum of Association of the said Association as subscribed by seven members thereof on the 14th day of June 1904, do by this their Licence direct THE MUSICAL ASSOCIATION (INCORPORATED 1904) to be registered with limited liability without the addition of the word "Limited" to its name.

### 2. REPORT OF THE COUNCIL.

The Council has pleasure in presenting the Report of the sixty-eighth Session, during which the following papers were read: (1). "Dvořák in England," by Dr. Viktor Fischl; (2). "Domestic Music under the Stuarts," by Mr. J. A. Westrup; (3). "The Clarinet in England," by Mr. F. Geoffrey Rendall (read by Mr. Oldman); and (4). "Haydn, fresh facts and old fancies," by Miss Marion Scott (read by Miss Katharine Eggar), with illustrations played by Dr. Emily Daymond. In addition the volume contains a postscript to Mr. Grosbayne's paper on the "Literature of Conducting," by Mr. Adam Carse. The Council wishes cordially to thank all these ladies and gentlemen for their valuable contributions.

The Council records with deep regret the death of Mr. W. S. Desborough, Mr. J. Cliffe Forrester, Mr. Augustus Littleton and Mr. C. Sanford Skilton. Mr. Littleton, who had been a member since 1916, was elected a Vice-President in 1925. Mr. Skilton, who resided in the U.S.A., had subscribed for over thirty years.

Ten new members were elected to the Association during the session and two members resigned. The total membership at the close of the session numbered 187, of which number four were Hon. Foreign, 34 Life Members and 149 subscribing members.

Meetings of Council were held on October the 23rd and May the 13th, at the Royal Academy of Music, and on July the 23rd at the Royal College of Music.

The Audited Accounts show a balance in hand on September 30th of £35 2s. 4d.

The Secretary gives notice that on 14th May, 1942, the Registered Office of the Musical Association was changed from 68 Shepherd's Hill, Highgate, London, N.6, to 14 Hillside Mansions, Jackson's Lane, Highgate, London, N.6, which change has been duly filed with the Registrar of Companies.

The adoption of the Report was proposed by Mr. Chadfield and seconded by Mr. Llewelyn Lloyd.

3. The Hon. Treasurer presented the Audited Accounts. Mr. Oldman, in proposing the adoption of the Accounts, moved a vote of thanks to Mr. Holland which motion the meeting heartily endorsed. Dr. Hinrichsen seconded the adoption.

Captain Broadwood raised the question of the Life Membership Subscription, suggesting that it should be increased. Mr. Lloyd proposed and Mr. Chadfield seconded that the Council be asked to consider this question and a report presented to the next General Meeting.

4. The Council list of nominations was then read to the meeting. The President said he regretted very much being compelled to resign the Chairmanship. In his place the Council had nominated Dr. Edmund H. Fellowes. The other nominations were the same as last year.

As the Secretary had received no other nominations, the Chairman declared those named to be duly elected, whereupon the new President was welcomed to the Chair. In the course of a short speech Dr. Fellowes thanked the retiring Chairman for his numerous services to the Association.

5. Votes of thanks were passed to the Council and to Mr. B. J. Dale, the Hon. Auditor. Votes of thanks were also passed to the Principal of the Royal Academy of Music and to the Director of the Royal College of Music for kindly lending their rooms for meetings.
