This book provides an in-depth commentary on the Hostages Convention and, to a lesser extent, the seven other agreements dealing with offences related to terrorism.

The first part examines the general background to the Hostages Convention, the growth in the phenomenon of international terrorism and the various efforts of the world community to deal with it.

The second and largest part of the book is an entirely new and comprehensive article-by-article commentary on the Hostages Convention itself. The latest volume of the *Yearbook* (63-II, 1990), which has just been published, contains the proceedings of the Institute's Santiago de Compostela session, held in September 1989, and includes scholarly reports, discussions, conclusions and resolutions (in English and French, as the case may be).

These deliberations focus on the following major issues:

- “Contemporary Problems Concerning the Jurisdictional Immunity of States” (*Rapporteur: Professor Ian Brownlie*).
- “Arbitration between States, State Enterprises, or State Entities, and Foreign Enterprises” (*Rapporteur: Mr. Arthur von Mehren, Co-Rapporteur: Mr. Eduardo Jiménez de Aréchaga*).
- “Equality of Treatment of the Law of the Forum and of Foreign Law” (*Rapporteur: Mr. Pierre Gannagé*).
- “The Protection Of Human Rights And The Principle Of Non-Intervention in Internal Affairs of States” (*Rapporteur: Mr. Giuseppe Sperduti*).

The preparatory work for the session, which was undertaken by specialized Commissions (of which the Institute has some 20 at present), including the reports and comments made thereon by Commission members, was published in the previous volume (63-I).

The Institute of International Law brings together 132 members and associate members selected from the world's most eminent specialists of public and private international law. The conclusions that have emerged from its meetings every 2 years have had a notable impact on the development and codification of international law.

DIGEST OF UNITED STATES PRACTICE IN INTERNATIONAL LAW, CUMULATIVE INDEX, 1973-1980

The Department of State's *Digest of United States Practice in International Law, Cumulative Index, 1973-1980* will be available after July 1 at the U.S. Government Printing Office (iii, 367). It represents an extensive revision of the individual indexes to the annual volumes, emphasizing the use of subject headings according to international law concepts, rather than the employment of a comprehensive alphabetical and geographical approach. An effort was made to achieve compatibility and consistency as among existing annual volume entries; and the entire consolidated index was revised, with additional entries being included to facilitate the location of material by researchers not personally familiar with the international legal events of the period covered. Some entries reflect events subsequent to the end of calendar 1980 that correspond to selective updating (by endnotes) beyond 1980 for a limited number of topics in the 1980 volume.

Proper names of persons and of most private, nongovernmental entities were eliminated, beginning with the 1979 *Digest*, and have been removed almost entirely from the *Cumulative Index, 1973-1980*. References to the *United States Code* and to the *Code of Federal Regulations*, not always indexed in the annual volumes and eliminated, beginning with the 1979 annual volume, have been removed entirely from the *Cumulative Index, 1973-1980*.

In addition to shortening research time, the *Cumulative Index, 1973-1980* will compensate, hopefully, in part for the increasing unavailability of the annual *Digest* volumes themselves, as these go out of print. Whether or not the out-of-print volumes become available some day on microfiche or by other means, the entries in the *Cumulative Index, 1973-1980* will enable requests for materials to be filled by photocopying and/or facsimile transmission from other libraries.
