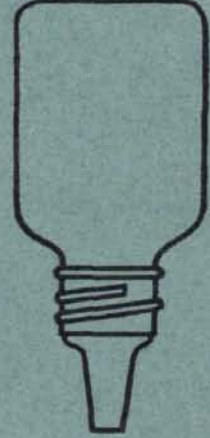
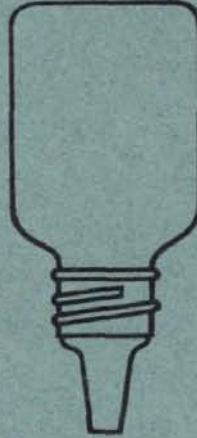
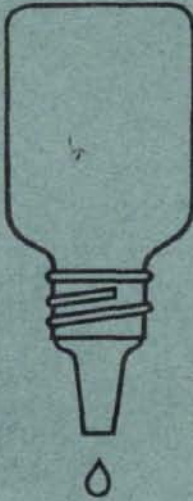
EAR, NOSE AND THROAT DEPARTMENT
