NEWS OF THE ASSOCIATION

The questionnaires which make up the Language and Area Studies Review, conducted under the auspices of the Office of Education, through the Social Science Research Council, have been mailed to all members. MESA has the highest percentage of returns of any of the area studies associations but many members still have not returned their forms. Members are strongly urged to spend the time necessary to complete the forms and return them as soon as possible. Current difficulties in funding programs for Middle East studies make a survey of the field especially important at this particular moment.

The Board of Directors is interested in receiving invitations for the Sixth Annual Meeting to be held on November 10-11, 1972. Members are urged to address invitations to the Secretariat. The Association seeks to hold its meetings in a location where a large number of small colleges can be served and where full conference facilities are available. The Fifth Annual Meeting will be held at the University of Denver, November 12-13, 1971.

The International Journal of Middle East Studies, the official journal of the Middle East Studies Association, appeared in January 1970. The Journal covers Iran, Turkey, Afghanistan, Israel, Pakistan and the countries of the Arab world, from the sixth century to modern times. Spain, Southern Europe, and the Soviet Union also is included for the periods in which their territories were parts of Middle Eastern empires or were under the influence of Middle Eastern civilizations. The Journal publishes articles and reviews of books dealing with history, political science, economics, geography, anthropology, sociology, art history, philology and literature, folklore, comparative religion, theology and philosophy. The Editor welcomes manuscripts as well as books and journals for review and also will include shorter notices of existing works which are reprinted. Listings of Programs in Middle East Studies have been standardized in the Bulletin. The winter issue (No. 1) carries the annual meeting report and summer programs for the following summer. The spring issue (No. 2) contains listings of foreign college and university programs in Middle East studies as well as late summer program listings.

If available, this issue will also carry the preliminary program for the annual meeting. In the fall issue (No. 3) the program for the annual meeting and the annual list of new and recently completed dissertations will appear. Colleges and universities are requested to send in dissertation lists to MESA Headquarters and Secretariat before October 1 of each year and to send in their summer program listings before January 15 of each year. Foreign colleges and universities are invited to send in listings of their programs no later than April 15 of each year.

The Middle East Studies Association of North America, Inc. (MESA) was organized in 1966 by a group of American and Canadian scholars on the Middle East to promote high standards of scholarship and instruction in the area, to facilitate communication among scholars through meetings and publications, and to foster cooperation among persons and organizations concerned with the scholarly study of the Middle East. The area included within the Middle East runs from Morocco to Pakistan and from Turkey to the Sudan. MESA is concerned with this area primarily since the rise of Islam and from the viewpoint of the social science and humanistic disciplines.

Persons of scholarly attainment in Middle East studies are eligible to become Fellows of MESA. Other categories of membership (nonvoting) are Associate, Student and Library Member. Application for membership is made on an application form obtainable from the Executive Secretary, Middle East Studies Association, New York University, 24 Waverly Place, Room 566, New York, New York 10003. Each application is acted upon individually. Membership is on a calendar year basis.
