APSA Publishes Nonacademic Career Guide and Undergraduate Faculty Directory

Alternative Careers for Political Scientists contains practical advice for obtaining nonacademic employment. The authors are political scientists who personally experienced and observed the employment opportunities they describe. Chapters cover the federal government executive branch, Capitol Hill, state and

local government, research and consulting, interest groups and associations, and corporate public affairs, as well as a general introduction to nonacademic careers. The cost is \$5 for APSA members and \$10 for nonmembers. Bulk order discounts are available to APSA Departmental Service members.
