THE author, who in a previous volume published the early terracotta decorations of Etruria and Latium, now deals with a region almost purely Greek. In lieu of marble, the exposed parts of these southern temples were protected by fictile revetments, the fragments of which have been revealed by chance finds and systematic excavations. This scattered material is presented in a descriptive catalogue with adequate illustrations; thus disclosing a wealth of form and design, a mastery in obtaining effects through simple colouristic means, which constitute a notable achievement of the Hellenic genius.
