AT THE INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS MUSEUM

At Castiglione, on 25 June, an exhibition by the ICRC was inaugurated at the International Red Cross Museum, attended by representatives of the Verona, Mantua and Milan sections of the Italian Red Cross, the Mayor of Castiglione, the Museum Director, a representative of the Henry-Dunant Institute and various people from neighbouring towns.

The ICRC had delegated Mr. C. Pilloud, who delivered an address on the importance of the Geneva Conventions, the inspiration for the exhibition, which will be open until the end of September 1972.

Documents exhibited relate to the Battle of Solferino, the first Geneva Convention, the progression of humanitarian law, the Central Tracing Agency and the relief activities of the ICRC. There are also posters and panels illustrating various phases of the work of the Red Cross. We recommend a visit, especially as it was in the nearby Chiesa Maggiore that Dunant tended the wounded and conceived the idea of relief to war victims without distinction.
