



DIRECTIONS FOR ILWCH CONTRIBUTORS: 1) an original & two copies of manuscripts are requested; 2) except for quotations, manuscripts must be in English; 3) doublespaced footnotes must be grouped together on pages separate from the manuscript and should conform to the Chicago Manual of Style; 4) manuscripts must be copy edited and proofread before submission; 5) maximum length of manuscripts: scholarly controversies=35 pp. including footnotes, substantive articles= 35 pp. including notes, controversy critiques=8 pp., review essays=25 pp. including notes, book reviews=8 pp., reports=8 pp., letters to the Editor=3 pp. Address manuscripts, correspondence, and books for review to: **Editor, ILWCH, History Department, Hall of Graduate Studies, Yale University, New Haven, CT 06520.**
