is published by the British School of Archæology in Iraq (Gertrude Bell Memorial). It is devoted to studies of the history, art, archæology, religion, and social life of Iraq, and to a lesser degree of the neighbouring countries (Iran, Armenia, Anatolia, Syria, and Arabia), from the earliest times down to about A.D. 1700. Texts concerning these subjects, with translations and comments, will be considered; exclusively philological articles will not be accepted.

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STUDENTSHIP

APPPLICATIONS are invited for a Studentship, tenable in 1947–1948, for work relating to the antiquities of Iraq or Syria, falling within one of the following descriptions:

- (a) Excavation.
- (b) Work in a museum for a catalogue or thesis or other special study.
- (c) Survey or examination of archaeological sites.
- (d) Recording of extant monuments.

CANDIDATES must be between the ages of 21 and 35, and of British Nationality. Both sexes are eligible.

A CANDIDATE will not normally be elected if engaged in any other paid occupation, but the studentship may be held conjointly with other emoluments of a similar kind.

THE STIPEND will not exceed £250, with £150 for travelling and other expenses if necessary.

THE PERIOD of the Studentship will depend on the work proposed, but will not normally exceed one year.
