RUSSIA, THE USSR, AND EASTERN EUROPE: A BIBLIOGRA-PHIC GUIDE TO ENGLISH LANGUAGE PUBLICATIONS, 1964-1974. Compiled by Stephan M. Horak. (Edited by Rosemary Neiswender).

No comprehensive survey of studies in English relating to the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe has appeared since Paul Horecky's Russia and the Soviet Union: A Bibliographic Guide to Western Publications (1965) and his companion volumes East Central Europe (1969) and Southeastern Europe (1969). Horak's new guide is designed to update bibliographic coverage of these areas in the social sciences and humanities by bringing together an annotated listing of significant titles published from 1964 to 1974.

The approximately 1,600 entries are accompanied by critical annotations excerpted (and in some cases adapted) from reviews published in major U.S. and British Slavic journals. In instances where no published reviews were found, annotations have been supplied by the compiler. Full bibliographic citations are given for the quoted reviews. The index includes authors, compilers, editors, and translators.

Because of its concentration on basic titles, augmented by authoritative critical reviews, this work should serve as a useful tool for a wide audience, including students, researchers, librarians, and the general reader with interests in the Slavic area. Public libraries as well as college and university libraries will find this indispensable both for reference work and for collection building.

DR. STEPHAN M. HORAK is professor of European and Russian history at Eastern Illinois University. His published works include: Poland's International Affairs, 1919-1960; Poland and Her National Minorities, 1919-1939; and Russia's Historical Way to Bolshevism. He has contributed numerous articles to such professional journals as Slavic Review, Canadian Slavonic Papers, and East European Quarterly.
