Sayyid Jamāl ad-Dīn "al-Afghānī" (1838–1897), best known as the ideologist of pan-Islam and of Islamic reform, has been the subject of much inconclusive controversy. In this study Mrs Keddie provides a consistent analysis of Afghānī's widely varying and sometimes contradictory words, translates some of his most important writings, and solves, through the use of new primary documents, the question of Afghānī's country of birth and upbringing. This is the first attempt to set Afghānī within the Islamic philosophic tradition and to explain the contradictions in his writings.

A HISTORY OF O.P.E.C. *Fuad Rouhani.* Ambassador Rouhani, who was the first Secretary-General of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries, details O.P.E.C.'s origins, structure, and function. He evaluates its achievements and the role it has assumed in the international oil industry's operations. He discusses the Teheran negotiations among six O.P.E.C. countries and the major oil companies, which, in February 1971, resulted in substantially increased royalties for the member countries. He concludes that O.P.E.C. will become an increasingly strong factor in the international oil picture. 300 pp., tables. \$17.50

THE ENIGMA OF ECONOMIC GROWTH: A Case Study of Israel. *David Horowitz.* The Governor of the Bank of Israel analyzes his country's rapid (10 percent per annum) growth since 1950, asserting that its economy will be self-sustaining by the end of the decade. He draws some basic conclusions about economic development in general, recognizing that some of the factors contributing to Israel's progress, such as massive immigration and a huge influx of foreign capital, do not always obtain elsewhere. THE GROWTH, LOCATION, AND STRUCTURE OF INDUSTRY IN EGYPT. *K.M. Barbour.* Dr. Barbour, a geography professor at the University of Ibadan, Nigeria, presents an in-depth study of the whole Egyptian industrial sector—mining, manufacturing, and services. He traces its growth and diversification, its relationship with population and resources, its concentration, and the degree to which growth poles exist.
