Proposals for participation in the XIVth World Congress of the International Political Science Association are cordially invited.

The theme of the congress will be "Toward a Global Political Science." Several sessions will be sponsored within the framework of Mini-Plenary Sections and Subfield Sections which will be organized by the Programme Committee. There will also be approximately 50 sessions that will be organized as Special Meetings.

Individuals who wish to organize Special Meetings or to participate as paper presenters, chairs, or discussants in sessions organized by the Programme Committee should send proposals to the Chair of the Programme Committee: Harold K. The initial deadline for the submission of proposals is March 1, 1987 and the final deadline is July 1, 1987. Proposals submitted before the initial deadline will receive priority consideration at the meeting of the Programme Committee in April 1987. The proposals should be as specific as possible and should supply

completed information including curriculum vita for the individuals who will be involved.
