The Health Commission of Victoria, Australia, seeks to recruit qualified psychiatrists to positions of Psychiatrist Superintendent, Consultant Psychiatrist, Psychiatrist (Senior Registrar) in the areas of general adult psychiatry, the recognised psychiatric specialities and the provision of psychiatric services to ethnic communities. A Senior Psychiatrist of the Health Commission of Victoria will travel throughout Eastern and Western Europe, the United Kingdom and Northern America in April/May 1985, to provide specific information packages to interested practitioners and to conduct preliminary discussions with prospective applicants.

Bilingual Psychiatrists and medical practitioners with a special interest in the Mental Health needs of Greek, Italian and Yugoslavian immigrants and their families resident in Australia will be offered positions under special funding arrangements and agreements.

Positions are available in both country and metropolitan facilities which would provide a wide variety of social, cultural and professional environments.

There are two established Chairs of Psychiatry within Psychiatric Hospitals, which would provide excellent opportunities for research and the ability to obtain higher qualifications.

The positions provide attractive salaries ranging from \$46,971—\$59,310 (AUS) depending on qualifications and experience. Conditions of employment include—4 weeks recreation leave, long service leave, sabbatical leave, low rental accommodation, air fares for successful applicants, spouses and their dependent children and relocation expenses.

Private treatment of anorexia nervosa

A specialist unit for the treatment of anorexia nervosa has been established at Bowden House Clinic. It is led by a consultant psychiatrist with a special interest and experience in the management of the condition, supported by a team of nurses and therapists trained in the care of anorexic patients.

Referring psychiatrists and physicians are given full facilities to work closely with the team so that they may themselves provide continuing care after in-patient treatment.

Bowden House Clinic – a member of the St. Andrew's Hospital Group of private psychiatric hospitals – is only 30 minutes by road from central London. Subscribers to private medical insurance schemes may be able to claim within the terms of their cover for treatment at the clinic.
