In general there should be no more than five references.

Conference briefings and reviews should be no more than 500 words.

Correspondence on subjects of topical interest is also welcome but letters should be no more than 500 words, with up to three references, and should not include diagrams or tables.

Please send three copies of all submissions, typed double-spaced, and using the Harvard system of referencing as in *The* British Journal of Psychiatry.

Contributions are accepted for publication on the condition that their substance has not been published or submitted for publication elsewhere. The views expressed in articles published in the *Psychiatric Bulletin* (except official College material) are the author's own and do not necessarily represent College policy.
