## Instructions to Contributors

*Political Analysis* publishes full-length articles on topics generally in the area of political methodology, including formal or positive models of political phenomena. The annual follows editorial procedures in general use in political science. All manuscripts are anonymously refereed by subject matter experts, often a mix of some editorial board members and some who are not. No manuscripts may be reviewed if concurrently under consideration elsewhere.

Manuscript format and preparation: Manuscripts to be considered for publication should be typed, double-spaced on one side of the paper. Of the four copies to be submitted, three should be free of any author identification on the cover and throughout the text of the manuscript. A brief abstract of the contents of the proposed article should be included in each. The journal uses as guide to matters of form and style the *Style Manual for Political Science*, a publication of the American Political Science Association's Committee on Publications.
