

### **Publication policy and notes for authors.**

The main purpose of this Journal is to provide a forum for psychologists, and those in related disciplines, within the South Pacific region. Although the emphasis is expected to be on the island nations, the focus is on psychology as a non-political discipline meaning that papers, reviews, and letters may be accepted from any part of World and may address any topic to do with psychology. However, the Editor and the Board reserve the right to reject submissions dealing with a too remote or specialistic subject matter.

Brevity, clarity, and good organization of material will be looked for. Authors should follow the format detailed in the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, 1200 Seventeenth Street, N.W. Washington, D.C. 20036, USA. The present issue of SPJP follows the format of the Second Edition of this Manual. Subsequent issues will follow the Third Edition which is now obtainable from the above address.

Papers submitted for publication should be typed double spaced on A4 paper and air-mailed to the Editor, South Pacific Journal of Psychology, Department of Psychology and Philosophy, P.O. BOX 320, University of Papua New Guinea, Papua New Guinea.
