CAEP **funds junior investigators** and **EM seed projects**. We established our research funding program in 1996, and over the past 20 years have assisted over 100 researchers. Since the inception of our grant program, we have provided over \$500,000 in funding to EM researchers. Typically, five grants of up to \$5,000 each are awarded annually. As catalysts for future research, our grants play a vital role in advancing EM research.

Due to the success of our membership fundraising campaign, we expanded the 2016/17 competition to include three grants of up to \$10,000 each, as well as a new partnership to provide matched funds for an additional grant over the next five years.

This is not enough. Funding for EM research in Canada is limited, particularly for junior physician-scientists. **The demand for research funding currently exceeds our capacity,** but with your support we are aiming to double our EM grant program.
