THE ROYAL ASIATIC SOCIETY'S EVENING LECTURES.

The President and Council of the Royal Asiatic Society have made arrangements for the delivery in future, during the course of each Session, of Evening Lectures on Oriental subjects, that is to say on the history, customs, religions and literature of Eastern nations, ancient and modern. The Lectures are intended to be such as will appeal generally to educated men and women, and not of a character to interest specialists only.

The great importance, from a national point of view, of the studies which it is the purpose of the Society to promote, has been long and universally admitted. Of late years moreover, a more correct appreciation of the attraction they are capable of presenting has been gradually, if slowly, gaining ground. The Council is therefore induced to believe that its new project, albeit as yet an experiment, will obtain such support, both from Members of the Society and from the general public, as will lead to its becoming a permanent feature in the work of the Society.

The Inaugural Lecture will be delivered by Professor Max Müller, on Wednesday evening the 4th of March, in the Lecture-hall of the University of London, Burlington Gardens, at half-past eight.
