Professor Martha Albertson Fineman's scholarship garners worldwide attention



Robert W. Woodruff Professor Martha Albertson Fineman has long-focused her scholarship on the regulation of intimacy and dependency. Her work has garnered the attention of scholars throughout the world, and most recently throughout Asia. Several of her books have been translated into Chinese and/or Japanese, including *The Autonomy Myth: A Theory of Dependency* (2004); *The Neutered Mother, The Sexual Family, and Other Twentieth Century Tragedies* (1995); and *The Illusion of Equality: The Rhetoric and Reality of Divorce Reform* (1991). Her work has also been discussed in articles published in the *Journal of South China Agricultural University*, the *Journal of Wuhan University of Science and Technology*, *Academic Monthly*, and the *Journal of China Women's University*, among many others.

Fineman's work on feminism and dependence inspired her latest scholarly focus on vulnerability theory, which emphasizes that vulnerability is the human condition. As embodied beings, we are continually susceptible to changes, both positive and negative, in our physical and social well-being. Our vulnerability necessitates that we be dependent on social institutions and relationships throughout our life course.
