REPORT.

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING WAS HELD ON TUESDAY,
4TH NOVEMBER, 1924, AT THE UNIVERSITY OF LONDON.

Mr. CLIFFORD B. EDGAR, Vice-President, in the Chair.

After the Minutes had been read and confirmed, the following REPORT was read by the Secretary :—

The Council beg to present their Report of the Fiftieth Session.

Papers read have included "Comedy and Drama in Folk Song," by Mr. Arthur A. Pearson, with illustrations sung by the lecturer; a series of three by Sir Henry Hadow on "The Balance of Expression and Design in Music," illustrations by the lecturer and Mr. Lloyd Powell; "Criticism of the Living," by Dr. George Dyson, with illustrations by the lecturer; "The Musical Nature of Speech and Song," by Sir Richard Paget, Bart., with illustrations and experiments by the lecturer; and "Violin Methods, Old and New," by Mr. Jeffrey Pulver. The warmest thanks of the Council are hereby tendered to the above gentlemen for their valuable papers.

During the Session the Meetings have been held at the College of Preceptors. Unfortunately this very suitable place is no longer available, but the Council are glad to say that they have been able to make arrangements to hold the Meetings at London University, South Kensington, for the coming Session. The attendance has been on the whole considerably better, but the discussions have shewn a falling off. This may possibly be due to the papers read not lending themselves so much as usual to discussion, but the matter is engaging the attention of the Council.

As the year was the fiftieth since the foundation of the Musical Association, efforts were made to stimulate interest in its work, by having a discussion at the December meeting, on the best way of making it better known and more effective. A number of suggestions were made, which will be duly considered by the Council.

The Annual Dinner was held at the Connaught Rooms on January 8th, 1924, the President in the chair. The occasion was in every way an outstanding success, 125 being present, the largest on record.

Although the aspiration of the Council, that the membership should in the jubilee year reach the figure of 300, was not

realised, it is satisfactory that a substantial accession of strength marked the Session, twenty-seven new Members having been elected. This brought the total membership of all classes to 244 as on June 30th, 1924. This is the highest in the history of the Association, and is so far gratifying, though the Council would be glad if Members would personally endeavour to gain new Members each year. Only in this way can inevitable losses be made good.

The Association has to deplore the loss by death of several distinguished Members, most of them of long standing. The death of Sir Frederick Bridge removed one who had ever taken the warmest interest in the Association, of which he was for three years the President, and this was followed within a few days by that of Sir Charles Stanford, Professor of Music at Cambridge, and a Vice-President of the Association. Other deaths include Dr. N. Kilburn, Mr. Frederick G. Fitch, Hon. Treasurer of the Royal Academy of Music, Mr. H. Heathcote Statham, F.R.I.B.A., Mr. Cecil J. Sharp, the eminent authority on folk music, Dr. F. Niecks, formerly Reid Professor of Music at Edinburgh, and Mr. Oliver D. Belsham, one of the auditors of the Association.

The audited Balance Sheet shows that the finances maintain that satisfactory condition spoken of in the last Report.

In accordance with the Articles of the Association, the President, Vice-Presidents, and the following five ordinary members of the Council, retire from Office: Mr. W. W. Cobbett, Mr. H.
