1966. In addition she was the recipient of many academic honours from the Universities of Sheffield, Yale, Harvard, Jerusalem, Vienna and Frankfurt, among others. In 1971 she was created CBE for her services to psychoanalysis.

Dr Margaret Methven, a Foundation Fellow of the College, died on 16 September 1982.

Margaret (Meg, as she was affectionately called by her intimates) qualified in Edinburgh in 1935 but received her early postgraduate training in psychiatry in England. She was appointed consultant in child psychiatry to the Royal Hospital for Sick Children, Edinburgh in 1948—a post she held with great distinction until her retirement in 1970. She was, in fact, the doyenne of child psychiatry in Scotland and in her time served as chairman of the Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Section of the RMPA. She served, too, as

president of the British Federation of Medical Women from 1965-66.
