## LIBRARIES AND ARCHIVES

*University of Arizona Library Purchases Panamanian Collection*—Recently the University of Arizona library purchased the 3000-item collection of Ernesto Castillero, Panamanian historian. It is the most complete collection assembled in the last 50 years on topics concerned with life in Panama. Approximately 105 bound volumes of pamphlet material are included. The collection helps to fulfill the national commitment of the University of Arizona in the Farmington

Plan, a nationwide program designed to procure and make available foreign materials in American universities.

**Ford Foundation Renews Library of Congress Grant**—In January 1967, the Ford Foundation made a renewal grant—this one in the amount of \$266,000 (see LARR II:3, p. 217)—to the Library of Congress for a three-year period, to permit the Hispanic Foundation to develop basic bibliographic and other research aids for Latin American studies in this country. During 1967, bibliographic and research tools published included: *Handbook of Latin American Studies: Humanities* (number 28); a revised edition of *Latin America: An Annotated Bibliography of Paperback Books*; *Latin America in Soviet Writings: A Bibliography*, volume 1 (1917–1958); and *Latin American History: Essays on Its Study and Teaching, 1898–1965*. An author index to volumes 1–28 of the *Handbook of Latin American Studies* was to be published at the end of the year.

**University of Kansas Library Purchases Portuguese Works**—The Gulbenkian Foundation of Portugal announced in the summer of 1967 a grant of \$10,000 to the University of Kansas, Lawrence, to be used in purchasing works in Portuguese on the history and civilization of Portugal. The Kansas library has already acquired considerable material on Portugal, especially in economic history.

**Mexican Archives to be Microfilmed, Catalogued**—Several U. S. libraries have been invited to form a consortium which will acquire for each of its contributing members, over the next several years, copies of a collection of microfilmed Mexican documents of major research significance. The contents of Mexico's archives, representing 400 years of recorded history, are still for the most part unpublished, uncatalogued, and inaccessible. Upon the initiative of the Mexican Academy of Genealogy and Heraldics, the State University of New York (Oyster Bay) International Studies and World Affairs program is organizing the consortium which will sponsor the monumental task. Preliminary work is to be done in Guadalajara, where several very important and ancient archives are concentrated in a small area and where the local and state authorities have offered cooperation.

It is estimated that a minimum of 10 consortium members will contribute \$25,000 each per year for the work. At least five years will be required to complete the microfilming process at the Guadalajara archives alone. Indexing and retrieval procedures have been worked out, as well as contract prices according to numbers of copies of microfilm sets. In charge of developing the consortium machinery is Nasser Sharify, director of the Office of International Librarianship, Learning Resources and Information Services of the International Studies

and World Affairs program, State University of New York, Planting Fields, Oyster Bay, N. Y. 11771.
